June 1, 2011 RESERVOIR LEVEL AND SNOW UPDATE

There is very little snowpack remaining. Only a handful of Snotel sites (including Wolf Creek) still show snow. The Upper Rio Grande is still above average, but the snowpack is now at 11 inches compared to its peak this year of 20 inches at the beginning of May. Flow in the Rio Grande at San Marcial remains well below average, but has increased in the past few days. Upstream at Otowi Bridge flow has been increasing but it is also below average. Storage in Elephant Butte/Caballo is still decreasing, unlike in the past two years at this time of year.
