Apr 2, 2012 RESERVOIR LEVEL AND SNOW UPDATE


This year the snowpack has begun melting earlier than average. The average snowpack in the Upper Rio Grande reaches its maximum in about 2 weeks. However, the current snowpack is declining relative to the average, and also declining in absolute terms. On Apr 1 it was 11.9 inches compared to the average value of 21.5 inches, and was also 2.6 inches less than it was in the middle of last month. Recent melting of the snowpack can also be seen at Wolf Creek Summit. There is however a 30% to 60% chance of snow through Tuesday night. Flow in the Rio Grande has begun increasing as a result of the snowmelt, both at Otowi Bridge in Northern New Mexico, and at San Marcial. Storage in Elephant Butte/Caballo is increasing at about 900 ac-ft/day, with Caballo now being filled instead of Elephant Butte.


